The After Degree Nursing Program (ADNP) is offered jointly by Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the University of Regina. As an ADNP student, you will have the opportunity to access services and experience student life offered by both institutions.

When you graduate, you will receive a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN) degree. You'll be ready to make a real difference in the lives of your clients and communities and work as a valuable member of the health care team.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants interested in applying to this program option must meet the following criteria:

- Successful completion of an approved university degree in an alternate field with a minimum AGPA of 70%
- Meet the English Language Proficiency (ELP) requirements as outlined on our website
- Successful completion of the admission requirement courses

ADMISSION REQUIREMENT COURSES

The following courses are required for admission and must be completed prior to the application deadline:

- English 100 level
- Statistics 100 level
- Indigenous Health Studies 100 or Indigenous Studies 100 level

Plus one of the following combinations of Human Anatomy and Physiology Courses:

- BIOL 110 and BIOL 111 (minimum grade of 60%);
- KIN 261 and KIN 262 (minimum grade of 60%);
- KIN 260, 267 (minimum grade of 60%), and 268 (grade of 60%)

Equivalent courses from alternate institutions will be considered. Please see the University of Regina, transfer credit database.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Students admitted to the ANDP will complete their program requirements in six (6) consecutive terms, which is equivalent to two (2) calendar years.

This is a full-time program with a combination of online and on-site course offerings. Students are required to attend courses and practice education experiences on-site, in the Regina area.

TRANSCRIPTS

Official transcripts from **ALL** post-secondary institutions attended must be submitted directly from the institutions to the University of Regina by March 15 for domestic applicants.

SELECTION PROCESS

Admission to the ADNP is based on competitive entry. Applicants who meet all admission requirements with the **highest AGPA** will be selected for the program.
